Too and Enough

Too = Very (but with a negative connotation)

Enough = Sufficient

Examples:

1. She's too sad to go to the party.
2. I have too much milk/rice/bread/cheese/Coca-cola. Bring some to the neighbors.
3. There are too many customers here. Let's go to another restaurant.
4. Are you going to be warm enough in that jacket?
5. There aren't enough chairs, so someone will have to stand.
